Julius Caesar

A politician in the Rome republic who helped extend the Roman Empire. He invaded Britain twice, unsuccessfully.

Claudius

The emperor who added Britain to the Roman Empire in 43AD on his second attempt.

Boudicca—A queen of the Iceni Tribe of Eastern England who led a major rebellion against the occupying Roman Forces. Her army was eventually defeated.

Reasons for the Roman Invasion of Britain

Natural resources (wool, leather, corn, silver, gold)

Slaves, ambition, power, revenge

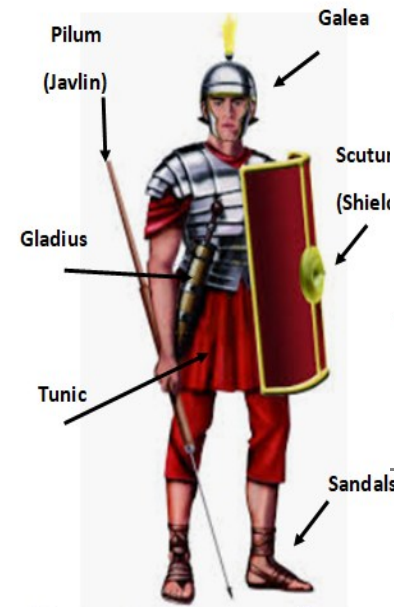
Hadrian's Wall

Caledonia (Scotland) was resistant to the Romans so Emperor Hadrian ordered a wall to be built, coast to coast.

Vocabulary	Definition
Celts	The name used to describe the tribes of people living during the Iron Age. The Romans called them Britons.
Tribe	A group of people who live together, share the same language, culture and history.
Empire	A group of nations ruled over by an emperor or other
Rebellion	Open, organised and often violent resistance to those in power.
Invalidate	To enter as an enemy, by force, often to conquer
Slave	A slave is a human being classed as property and who is
