Palaeolithic Era

Mesolithic Era

- Humans start to live in larger settlements but are still nomadic in camps near rivers.

Neolithic Era

- Groups began to settle rather than travel
- They became more agricultural

Bronze Age

- Humans start to use metals, specifically bronze, to create tools.
- Settlers started to travel to the UK, bringing their metalwork skills with them.


Iron Age

- Iron became the main choice of material for making farm tools.
- Settlers lived in hill-based forts and worked on small farms.
